Pursuant to the Court's instruction, Defendants submit the balance of witnesses whom they presently contemplate calling at trial. A brief description of the subject matter of each person's testimony is also provided. In addition, each of the defendant's scientific witnesses will testify as to what is and what is not science. In the event that additional subject areas are to be discussed by a witness at trial, defendants will notify plaintiffs' counsel so as to ensure that counsel may adequately prepare for such testimony. Further, defendants reserve the right to supplement this list, and, if necessary, to delete one or more witnesses altogether.

1. Dr. Larry E. Parker 2131 Starasburq Court Dunwoody, Georgia

Dr. Parker will testify to the educational merit of a two-model approach to teaching origins and will testify as to reasons why some teachers are reluctant to teach creation-science, including fear of litigation. Dr. Parker is an Associate Professor in the Department of Curriculum and Instruction at Georgia State, University. He received his Ed. D. from the University of Tennessee and is the author of articles and materials on academic freedom.

Dr. John N. Moore.

Dr. Moore will testify that as a matter of academic freedom both creation-science and evolution-science should be taught. Dr. Moore has written and studied extensively on the subject of academic freedom. Dr. Moore currently is an instructor in biology education at Michigan State University. He received his Ed. D. from Michigan State University.

3. Dr. Edward Boudreaux Department of Chemistry University of New Orleans New Orleans, Louisiana 70122

Dr. Boudreaux will discuss the findings of his personal research which support the validity of the creation-science model. Dr. Boudreaux holds a Ph.D. from Tulane and has been employed for the past 19 years as a researcher and instructor at the University of New Orleans.

4. Dr. Gerardus D. Bouw 4800 Broadview Road, #11 Cleveland, Ohio 44109

Dr. Bouw will testify that neither creation-science nor evolution-science can be proved absolutely. He believes that in the interest of academic fairness both models should be presented in the classroom, and that creation-science can be taught in a secular, scientific manner. Dr. Bouw holds a Ph.D. in astronomy from Case-Western Reserve University in Cleveland, and currently is employed as an instructor in astronomy at Baldwin Wallace University in Cleveland.

 Dr. G. Russell Akridge 140 Fernhill Court Roswell, Georgia 30075

Dr. Akridge will testify generally on the scientific evidence supporting creation-science. As a former teacher, he will testify that he believes that both models should be taught, and that creation-science can be taught in a scientific, non-religious manner. Dr. Akridge received his Ph.D. in physics from Georgia Tech University and a Master of Theology Degree from New Orleans Baptist Theological College. He is a former teacher both at the University and secondary levels. He has published several articles regarding the scientific basis of creation-science.

6. Dr. Larry Vardiman 11945 Walnut Court Alburn, California 95603

Dr. Vardiman will testify on evidence concerning the happening of a worldwide flood. Dr. Vardiman has researched and developed models of atmospheric conditions before the flood. Dr. Vardiman holds a Ph.D. in atmospheric science from Colorado State University. He is currently employed by the Bureau of Reclamation in the Department of Interior.

7. Dr. Hilton Hinderliter M.R. 10, Box 202 Apollo, Pennsylvania 15603

Dr. Hinderliter will testify generally concerning the scientific proof supporting creation-science. Dr. Hinderliter received his Ph.D. in Nuclear Physics from Pennsylvania State University. He is employed as an Assistant Professor of Physics at the New Kensington campus of Penn State.

8. Dr. Vern McMahon 1514 Whitman Street Laramie, Wyoming 82070

Dr. McMahon will testify that insufficient evidence exists to support the evolution-science model that all life evolved from a single cell. Dr. McMahon has a Ph.D. from the University of Illinois in Plant Physiology and has studied extensively in the field of biochemistry. He taught biochemistry for 14 years at the University of Wyoming and is currently a private consultant.

9. Dr. Iftikhar Khan Cary Medical Center Caribou, Maine

Dr. Kahn will testify that both the evolution-science and creation-science models are supported by evidence. He believes that both models of origins should be taught. Dr. Khan holds a Ph.D. in Biochemistry from the University of Nebraska.

10. Dr. Gerald Van Dyke.

Dr. Van Dyke has studied extensively in the area of mycology fungi. He will discuss the results of his studies which show a lack of evidence for the evolution-science model in this area. Dr. Van Dyke received his Ph.D. in Plant Pathology from the University of Illinois. He is currently an Associated Professor of Botany and Plant Pathology at North Carolina State University. He has written extensively in the field of mycology fungi.

11. Dr. Terrance L. Smith 2716 East California Street Urbana, Illinois 61801

Dr. Smith will testify generally on the scientific evidence in support of creation-science. He holds a Ph.D. in Microbiology from the University of Illinois, and is currently a research associate in the Illinois University Microbiology Department. He has published several articles on the subject of microbiology.

Dr. Frair has carried on active research in biochemetic taxonomy since 1962. He will testify that his findings indicate substantial evidence supporting a limited change model specifically and creation-science generally. Dr. Frair holds a master in Embryology from the University of Massachusetts, and a Ph.D. in Zoology from Rutgers University. Dr. Frair has taught at Kings College for 26 years.

13. Dr. Ariel A. Roth

Geoscience Science Research Institute Loma Linda University Loma Linda, California 92350

Dr. Roth will discuss findings from his research on coral reefs, past and present, which indicates support for the creation-science model. Dr. Roth holds a Ph.D. in Zoology from the University of Michigan, and is currently employed as a paleontologist at the Geoscience Research Institute.

14. Mr. John Lankford

Science Teacher Van Buren Jr. High School Van Buren, Arkansas

Mr. Lankford will testify that evolution-science and creation-science can both be taught in a scientific, nonreligious manner. He will discuss the teaching unit he prepared on creation-science. Mr. Lankford holds a Masters degree from the University of Arkansas and he has done postgraduate work in biology at the University of Arkansas.

15. Dr. George F. Howe

Dr. Howe will testify that evolution-science which is being presented in schools to the exclusion of other models, is no more scientific than creation-science. He will state that much of the teaching of evolution includes material which falls into the category of philosophy and religion. Dr. Howe holds a Ph.D. in plant physiology from Ohio State University and has done post-doctoral work in radiation biology at Cornell University. He is currently an instructor at Los Angeles Baptist College.

16. Dr. Norman Geisler

Dallas, Texas

Dr. Geisler will testify as to what constitutes "religion." Dr. Geisler will testify on the religious nature of much secular thought. Dr. Geisler is currently a professor of Systematic Theology at Dallas Theological Seminary. He holds a Ph.D. in philosophy from Loyola University of Chicago.

17. Jim Townley

Southside High School

Fort Smith, Arkansas

Mr. Townley teaches chemistry and honors chemistry at Fort Smith Southside. He will testify that he does not now teach creation science because of uncertainty about the current state of the law, but would feel free to do so under Act 590. Mr. Townley holds a Masters in geology from the University of Oklahoma. He is president of the Fort Smith Classroom Teachers Association.

18. Dr. Harold G. Coffin Geoscience Research Institute Loma Linda University Loma Linda, California 92354

Dr. Coffin will testify that the fossil record supports the creation-science model. Dr. Coffin holds a Ph.D. in vertebrate zoology from the University of Southern California. He has done post-doctoral work in zoology and paleontology at the University of Southern California, and is the author of four books, including three on creation-science.

19. Mr. David McQueen Route 11, Box 54 Petersburg, VA 23803

Mr. McQueen will testify concerning the relationship of the fossil record to the creation-science model of origins. In addition, he will discuss his work in structural geology. Mr. McQueen has a Masters Degree in Geology from the University of Michigan at Ann Arbor.
